DAY 1

ARRIVAL AT KATHMANDU

DAY 2

Kathmandu and Lumbini

After breakfast, begin the day with a visit to the iconic Swayambhunath Stupa, peacefully situated on a hilltop overlooking Kathmandu Valley. Revered by both Buddhists and Hindus, this UNESCO World Heritage Site is one of Nepal's most important spiritual landmarks. Explore the ancient complex, admire the golden vajra, prayer wheels, Buddha images, and colorful prayer flags, while enjoying sweeping views across the Kathmandu Valley. Continue toward the historic Shree Vajreshwari Yogini Devi Mandir near the Bishnumati River, where ancient Hindu and Buddhist traditions meet in a peaceful and culturally rich setting.

In the afternoon, visit the magnificent Boudhanath Stupa, one of the world's largest and most revered Buddhist stupas. Walk slowly around the sacred kora, observe pilgrims and monks engaged in prayer, and take in the distinctive architecture, prayer wheels, monasteries, and vibrant atmosphere surrounding the great white dome. Depending on arrival time, begin exploring the peaceful Lumbini area, including the sacred Mayadevi Temple and Garden, the Ashoka Pillar, and the tranquil pond associated with Buddha's birth. You can also discover monasteries representing different Buddhist traditions from around the world, each offering its own distinctive architecture and cultural character. As evening falls, slow down and reflect on the profound significance of Lumbini, the place where Siddhartha Gautama was born and where this remarkable spiritual journey began.

DAY 3

LUMBINI-SRAVASTI

Leaving the sacred birthplace of Buddha in Lumbini, your Buddhist pilgrimage continues by road toward Sravasti, one of the most important ancient centers of Buddhism. After a meaningful day of exploration and reflection, settle into your comfortable hotel and enjoy a peaceful evening, ready for the next chapter of your Buddhist journey.

Today, your Buddhist pilgrimage continues from Sravasti toward Kushinagar, traveling through the towns and countryside of northern India. As the landscape changes along the way, the journey gradually leads you to one of the most sacred destinations in the Buddhist world—the place traditionally regarded as where Buddha attained Parinirvana.

Kushinagar holds profound spiritual significance for Buddhists around the globe. According to Buddhist tradition, it was here that Siddhartha Gautama spent his final days and entered Parinirvana. The peaceful atmosphere of the town invites quiet reflection, offering an opportunity to contemplate the impermanence, compassion, and wisdom at the heart of Buddhist teachings.

Begin your exploration at the Ramabhar Stupa, an imposing ancient monument traditionally associated with Buddha's cremation. Continue to the Mahaparinirvana Temple, home to its remarkable reclining Buddha image, which represents Buddha's final passage into Parinirvana. The serene surroundings and centuries of pilgrimage give the site a deeply contemplative atmosphere.

Your journey continues to the Matha Kuar Shrine, where you can see a beautiful Buddha image depicting the earth-touching gesture, or Bhumisparsha Mudra, symbolizing the moment of enlightenment. As evening arrives, take time to absorb the peaceful atmosphere of Kushinagar and reflect on the significance of this sacred place. After a rewarding day of Buddhist heritage and spiritual discovery, settle into your hotel for a comfortable overnight stay, carrying with you the memories of another important chapter in the journey through the life and teachings of Buddha.

Leaving the peaceful surroundings of Kushinagar, your journey continues toward Nepal, following the story of Buddha back toward the places connected with his early life. Travel through Gorakhpur before reaching Sunauli, the busy India–Nepal border crossing. After completing the necessary immigration and border formalities, cross into Nepal and continue toward Lumbini, where the landscape and atmosphere begin to feel increasingly connected to the story of Siddhartha Gautama.

After arriving in Lumbini and enjoying lunch, continue toward Kapilavastu, the ancient Shakya kingdom where Siddhartha Gautama spent his childhood and early years before beginning his spiritual quest. Along the way, visit the Lumbini Crane Sanctuary, a peaceful natural area where you can enjoy Nepal's beautiful landscape and observe the graceful Sarus cranes and other birdlife.

Continue to the archaeological remains of Kapilavastu, traditionally associated with Siddhartha's early life and the Shakya kingdom. Explore the ancient ruins and remnants of the palace complex while learning about the life he experienced before leaving royal life in search of enlightenment. Standing among these quiet archaeological remains offers a fascinating opportunity to reflect on the transformation of a young prince into the Buddha.

As the day comes to an end, return to your accommodation and take time to reflect on the journey so far from Buddha's birthplace and places of teaching to the landscapes of his childhood. This meaningful day connects the historical and spiritual chapters of Buddha's life while bringing you closer to the heart of Nepal's Buddhist heritage.

After breakfast, bid a peaceful farewell to Lumbini, carrying with you the memories of your journey through the sacred places connected with Buddha's life. Drive to Bhairahawa Airport for your flight back to Kathmandu, enjoying beautiful aerial views of Nepal's green plains, hills, and changing landscapes along the way.

Upon arrival in Kathmandu, transfer to your hotel and enjoy some free time to relax or explore the city at your own pace. You may wander through the local streets, visit nearby cultural sites, shop for traditional handicrafts, or simply take a moment to reflect on the spiritual and cultural experiences gathered throughout your Buddhist journey.

Frequently asked questions

What is the Nepal Buddhist Circuit Tour?

This is a 7-day spiritual and cultural journey connecting important Buddhist heritage sites in Nepal and northern India, including Kathmandu, Lumbini, Sravasti, Kushinagar, and Kapilavastu. It follows key places associated with Buddha's life, teachings, and early Buddhist history.

What are the main Buddhist sites visited?

Highlights include Swayambhunath and Boudhanath in Kathmandu, Lumbini and the Mayadevi Temple, Kapilavastu, Sravasti's ancient monasteries, and Kushinagar's Mahaparinirvana Temple and Ramabhar Stupa.

Do I need a visa for India and Nepal?

Yes, depending on your nationality, you may need appropriate visas or entry permissions for both countries. Because this itinerary crosses the Nepal–India border, travelers should carry a valid passport and check the latest visa and border requirements before departure.

What transportation is used during the tour?

The journey combines private road transportation and domestic flights. You will travel by road between major pilgrimage sites and take a flight between Kathmandu and Bhairahawa/Lumbini where scheduled. Border-crossing procedures are completed at the Nepal–India border.

What type of accommodation is provided?

You will stay in comfortable, carefully selected hotels throughout the journey. Accommodation is generally based on twin-sharing rooms, with private rooms available at an additional cost depending on availability.

What food and drinking water are available?

You can enjoy a variety of Nepali, Indian, and international meals throughout the tour. Safe drinking water is available, and carrying a reusable water bottle is encouraged. Vegetarian meals can be arranged according to your preference.

Is this tour physically demanding?

The tour is moderate and primarily cultural, rather than a high-altitude trekking journey. There is considerable sightseeing and some walking around archaeological sites, temples, monasteries, and heritage areas. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

What should I bring for the Buddhist pilgrimage?

Bring a valid passport, appropriate visas, comfortable walking shoes, lightweight and respectful clothing, sun protection, a reusable water bottle, personal medication, travel insurance, and a small daypack. Modest clothing is particularly important when visiting temples, monasteries, and other sacred places.
